Cos from US & Dubai keen on aviation hub near airport



Noida: The Noida International Airport Ltd (NIAL), a state government agency overseeing the internationalairport project in Jewar. will launch two schemes this month to set up units manufacturing aircraft spare parts and an MRO (maintenance, repair, and overhaul) hub on 1,365 hectares that are being acquired for the airport's second phase. The Authority has allocated 405 hectares each for the two projects.

Sixteen international companies, including those from Singapore, the USA and Dubai, have expressed interest in the aviation hub project, officials said, adding a consultant company, PwC, has been directed to prepare a layout for the NI-AL's first-ever scheme of the aviation hub.

"The aviation hub will come up on the northern side of the airport project along the YEIDA sectors. Most of the plots will be of 5 acres, but some will be 10 acres or even more for anchor units. Companies manufacturing aircraft, or involved in manufacturing spare parts like engines,






Aviation hub layout Prepared by PwC




Tarmac at MRO hub To have runway for planes to land

nozzles, wings, and other important equipment, will be given plots here. Talks have been held with many American companies through the US embassy. Some Singapore and Dubai-based companies are also in touch with us," NIAL CEO Arun Vir Singh said.

Jewar will also be developed as the country's largest MRO hub and will be equipped with a runway for planes to land and take off. An expression of interest is set to be issued to select a developer soon. The CEO added the new FDI policy approved by the state government has made investment by foreign com panies easier.

"Preference will be gi ven to companies with 100% FDI along with those which have been featured in the Fortune magazine. Compa nies fulfilling the condi tions will also be given the benefits of the FDI policy including land subsidie and exemptions from cus toms duty and state GS' among others. With the ar rival of these companies employment opportunitie along with investment will increase," Singh added.
