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# 1st phase of Delhi-Meerut **Expressway inaugurated**

Delhi-Meerut Expressway

First phase — from Nizamuddin Bridge to UP Gate — completed in record

NEWDELH: Prime Minister Naren-dra Modi on Sunday inaugurated thefirst phase of the T7.500-crore Delhi-Meerut Expressway or Sunday. Once completed, the expressway is expected to reduce the travel time from Delhi to Meerut to around 45 minutes

from existing two hours.

The first phase of the 14-lane Delhi-Meerut Expressway, being built by the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), spans between the Nizamuddin Bridge and UP Border in Gazipur. This stretch was built at a cost of 7842 crore, officials said. The total cost of the project on comple-tion is estimated to be ₹7,500

Modi held a road show at inauguration cere-mony and travelled in an open jeep for around 6km along the stretch. The road show com-

menced from the Nizamuddin Bridge—the starting point of the newly constructed highway. The newly opened stretch will

facilitate residents of east Delhi colonies, NCR neighbourhoods like Indirapuram, Vaishali and Kaushambi in Ghaziabad, Noida and Greater Noida (west) as it is expected to significantly redu travelling time across Delhi-

round an hour to travel from Noida Extension to Laxmi Nagar, but once the remaining section of the NH-24 is expanded (as part of the expressway), the time travel would be reduced by half an hour.

The expressway will remove 31 traffic signals on the Delhi-Meerut streich, which is among the busiest highways in the region. The expressway will have dedicated bicycle tracks on the around 28-km streich between flow. Kaushik, who lives in

Delhi and Dasna. Alok Kaushik another commuter who is a banker and regu-larly uses the stretch, said that driving on a beautiful, smooth

and properly lit road, was a great experience. "Earlier, I used to commute via Noida Link Road to reach my office in Model Town, but now I use the expressway and save around 15 to 20 minutes. Entry

#### Noida said.

Commuters also praised the beautification work on the stretch and said it was a positive changefrom the usual road infra-structure. Replicas of Qutub Minar and Ashok Stambh (Ashoka Pillar), fountains, vertical gardens, solar panels and murals have been made at NH-24.

However, secretary general, Confederation of NCR RWAs (CONRWA) - an apex body of all RWAs of NCR region - Chetan Sharma said the expressway

lacks of proper signage and light-

ing.
"There is signage on the expressway, but it lacks smaller ones which are usually placed a few hundred metres before the

exit or entry points, "he said. The Delhi-Meerut Expressway project has been divided in five phases — Nizamuddin Bridge to UPborder (around 8.7km), Ghaz-ished to Dasna, Dasna to Meerut,

Dasna to Hapur and a connector from Hapur to Meerut. Under Phase One of the project, a total of five flyovers have come up, officials said.
