- Barring River Hindon and Shaheed Nagar six stations has station buildings on both sides interconnecting platforms through footover bridges
- All the stations have four levels ground, concourse, platform and roof. Only River Hindon station has five levels, including lower ground level for parking
- At all stations (except Hindon River) FOB at concourse level comprises of paid and unpaid sections for the use of metro commuters and general public respectively
- People who do not wish to use the metro can use the FOB to cross the road by accessing the unpaid part of the FOB
- All the stations are disabled friendly
- Parking will be made available for the general public at the Shaheed Nagar, River Hindon and New Bus Adda stations

GHAZIABAD: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday laid foundation stone and inaugurated several infrastructure projects worth ₹32,513 crorein the city. He said that Ghaziabad henceforth will be known with growth in three Cs - connectivity, cleanliness and capital.

PM Modi inaugurated the Delhi Metro's 9.6km Red Line extension from Dilshad Garden to Shaheed Sthal (New Bus Adda) on which the passenger operations will commence from Saturday. The PM also in augurated the much-awaited regional flight terminal constructed at a cost of ₹60 crore at the Hindon airbase.

"The city has now got road, train and metro connectivity. It has taken strides and jumped from 351st position in 2017 to 13 in 2019 in the Swachh Survekshan, results of which were announced on Thursday. The capital investment in the city is also growing as more businesses and set-ups have come up. We are working on the same lines to develop other cities in the country," Modi said.

The new Red Line extension in Ghaziabad will take city passengers up to Rithala in Delhi. The addition of the new section will gar, and Kalaburgi (Gulbarga).

increase the Red Line stretch to 34.72km. A total of 35 six-coach trains will be operated on the corridor at peak hour frequency of six minutes. The fare within eight stations of Ghaziabad is pegged at ₹10-30.

The new regional terminal inaugurated is located at Sikandapurnear the Hindon airbase. It is proposed to operate regional flights under regional connectivity (UDAN scheme) to cities like Nasik, Pithoragarh, Kannur, Hubli, Faizabad, Shimla, Jamna-

"It was our dream that a person wearing slippers will be able to take flights at cheap rates. We are aiming at development with two stepstrategy-strengthening the infrastructure and giving direct benefits to poor. We also aim to improve connectivity between Delhi and Meerut. For this, we have laid the foundation stone for country's first rapid train project which will reduce travel time to one hour," the PM said.

The Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS), the rapid rail network, among others.

project, will connect Delhi, Ghaziabad and Meerut by a 82km dedicated network and will also give interchange with the metro train system.

The project is pegged at ₹30,274 crore and the first stretch to be taken up under the project will be from Sahibabad to Duhai. The project has a scheduled deadline of 2024. The PM also laid the foundation stone and inaugurated other smaller projects related to city's trafficinfrastructure, housing, water supplies, and sewer
